Message from Deb Executive Director

Since our launch late March of 2009, Love INC of Linn County

March 2016

has continued to expand your ministry to our community. But our small rented office space is no longer adequate. We now have twelve volunteers staffing the phone lines each week answering 4,421 calls in 2015! The durable medical goods ministry that began in the attic of Lebanon Mennonite delivered nearly 500 pieces of equipment last year! Housing for this

ministry has been graciously provided by the Mennonite Village for years but they need to repurpose that facility now. In addition, Church volunteers acquired, prepared and delivered free firewood for over 40 families in need! Diapers, blankets and linens, towels, household goods, maternity clothes, were all given as well as school supplies, coats, and Christmas gifts to 500 children. None of this would have been possible without your involvement, and with your continued support we will be able to do even more.

We would like to provide opportunity to expand the help the Church offers our community through Love INC of Linn County. It seems good and prudent to offer more "Teaching to Fish" developmental compassion rather than just the giving of things that often times may keep folks stuck in the place of dependency. The foundation of this expansion is the purchase of a new facility, pictured below, to house our organization as it continues to grow.

This year David came to us in need of steel toed work boots so that he could take the job being offered him. We happened to have a pair just his size in our office! There are many 'Davids' out there being offered jobs but not having the proper apparel to work. Restaurants require no slip shoes, construction jobs often ask for rain gear, rubber boots, and steel toed work boots, for many retail jobs black or khaki pants are in order, and some positions require more professional office wear.

How can people afford all of this outfitting before their first pay check? Our new facility has room to house a career closet where the local churches, through Love INC, could

work with staffing agencies to help get folks back to work.

Our new facility also offers space to house some much requested classes on budgeting, parenting as well as other life skills.

In addition, the new property also has a 960 sq ft shop to comfortably house our medical ministry!

Please join us in prayer that Love INC of Linn County would secure this new facility to provide opportunity for many more to know the transforming Love of Christ through His mobilized Church.

Just like the ant described in Proverbs 6:6-8, the wise person saves for future needs. Love INC has 3 ministries toward the end of the year that you might be able to help us with:


> August—School Supply Give Away October—Coat Give Away

Volunteers

Love INC Medical Ministry

Ron Lucas has been involved with the Medical Ministry at Love INC for nearly 4 years. He started out by assisting the former Medical Ministry Coordinator, Sterling Burkey. Ron and Sterling used to stop at thrift stores and garage sales handing out a Love INC card and gathering medical equipment. Gradually Love INC outgrew the medical storage space, and the Mennonite Village graciously offered the use of a larger building.

As the ministry was growing, Sterling encountered some health problems that forced him to retire, so Ron took over as Coordinator. Because of the growth of the ministry, Ron is



involved with other volunteers in picking up donated medical equipment, cleaning and adjusting the equipment (they are not able to do repair work, but they sometimes replace an armrest that is cracked, adjust brakes on wheel chairs, and occasionally swap out a wheel if available), coordinating appointments for delivery, and actual delivery of the medical equipment to our clients. Most of the donated equipment comes from people who no longer need these items, but some come from care facilities in Linn County.

He said that most people don't realize how difficult life is for people in need, and this ministry gives him the opportunity to both see the need and to offer help. His favorite part is delivering needed equipment and talking and praying with our clients. Sometimes a client will say, "this time I will pray for you!" He is delighted to see the joy people have when they receive something they really need. God is the provider but He uses Love INC volunteers to share His love with people.

Favorite story— a lady who had a hip replacement was sleeping in a love seat with her legs propped up on the arm of the love seat because the doctor said she could not use her recliner to sleep in. Ron & another volunteer delivered a hospital bed, a shower bench, and a cane. Two weeks later she met them at the door, walking with the cane.

Loads of Love

In both Corvallis and Lebanon some churches have made it possible for their neighbors in need to have their laundry done for free at a local laundromat. Albany Helping Hands provided this resource here in town for several years until the cost became prohibitive. Corvallis offers up to three loads for twelve qualifying families once a month. Lebanon has multiple churches participating each taking a week so the whole month is covered. They allow families to wash up to two loads a week with a family cap of \$10 per month (they don't count the cost of soap nor dryer time).

Wouldn't it be wonderful to begin a similar ministry (through Love INC) in Albany?

Here is an example of who we could help: A mother with a baby and a 4 year old boy were having dinner at the park. Deb noticed that the 4 year old was eating very carefully. She complemented the boy and his mother. His mother said they had a large pile of clothing that needed to be washed but she didn't have money to wash them. She had told her son that he had to be very careful not to get his clothes dirty before they were able to get them washed. What an overwhelming responsibility for a 4 year old boy!
