## Helping May Be A Challenge

You have probably heard this story (Luke 10:30-37):

Along the road from Jerusalem to Jericho, a Jew was beaten, robbed and left half dead. The 18 mile road had a rough, rocky terrain, which was a haven for robbers (and this lewish man was a victim of their mischief).

A Samaritan was traveling along that road, and even though Samaritans and Jews did not get along, this Samaritan had compassion on the man. Unlike the priest and the Levite who had previously passed by this man and ignored him, this Samaritan bandaged the man's wounds and placed him on his own animal (the man was too injured to walk). The Samaritan took him to an inn and cared for him. When the Samaritan needed to leave, he gave the innkeeper some money (2 days wages) and asked him to take care of the injured man until he (the Samaritan) could return.

There are times when many of us see people in need, and like the priest and Levite, we choose to ignore them. Often we don't know how to help. We don't want to give money that might go toward supporting an addiction or wasted on something that isn't a necessity. We are fairly sure we don't have enough time to help them out of their situation, and we aren't sure they wouldn't just return to their original state of need after we helped them. So how do we offer a helping hand to lift them up?

The Samaritan chose to help with the injured man's immediate distress, and then helped him move toward full healing. It was costly in both time and money. To help someone out of their suffering (and many of us have been in that place from time to time), we must first help them understand their value in God's eyes. God created them and loves them. He gave them abilities and life experiences that He can use, if they are willing to cooperate with Him.

Our Affirming Potential Class is a way that Love INC of Linn County is offering to help people move out of their state of need to a place of wholeness and health, as they participate in the process and are mentored by Christian volunteers. This winter we are offering a class to help people in this way. We may not be able to help everyone, but we hope to introduce some people to Jesus and support them as they learn from God to walk in new ways. We value your prayers.

## **Spotlight on Volunteers**

## Janet Cross—Phone Intake Volunteer

Phone Intake Volunteers are often the first individuals that people talk with at Love INC. People call us to help them work through difficult situations in their lives, and they are often seeking money or some sort of supplies that they need. So it is the job of the Phone Intake Volunteers to listen to the person's story, and with God's guidance, offer suggestions, encourage positive solutions, and pray for them. We talked with one of our Phone Intake Volunteers to give you some insight into the job.

Janet Cross has been volunteering as a Phone Intake Volunteer since Love INC of Linn County opened in 2008. She comes in one day every other week for about 4 hours to answer phones. She started volunteering for a couple of reasons. She wanted an opportunity to get to know some people that she wouldn't normally encounter in her life and learn to think differently about them. She thought it was a worthy cause to help people in need, and she liked the fact that she could volunteer for as much time as she had available. The Love INC is open Monday through Thursday from 9 am - 1 pm and Tuesdays from 5-8 pm.

Her first challenge was to learn the computer program, when she didn't have much computer experience. However, she found that she could learn to use the program over time and with the help of other staff and volunteers. She likes being able to help people with supplies and services, but she especially likes being able to pray for people. We ask if we can pray for someone and there are very few people who say no. It is an opportunity to begin a relationship with people and point them to God.

Janet said that the most rewarding part of the job is being able to share Christ as we talk about the supplies they are asking for. The most challenging aspect is finding ways to convey in an appropriate way that there are some things they can do to help themselves. She said she has discovered some alarming situations, including young mothers with no place to live. She is glad to have the support, wisdom and prayers of staff and other volunteers as she seeks solutions to big problems.

She remembers one success story that she was involved in. She became aware of a lady she knew who was just home from the hospital after having a hip replacement and needed a shower chair. It wasn't Janet's day to work, and the phone lines to Love INC were all busy. So Janet stopped by the Love INC office. As she was getting out of her car, Ron and Curt (medical ministry volunteers) were getting out of their truck. Janet was able to talk with them about the shower bench, which they had. Janet was able to fill out the needed paperwork and take the shower bench to the lady. It is a rare occurrence to have everything cont-

happen in such a short time, but God had answered Janet's prayers very quickly that time.

Janet would recommend that other Christians volunteer at Love INC as Phone Intake Volunteers because it is a worthwhile ministry, spiritually and emotionally challenging, and she loves the camaraderie of working with the other volunteers and staff.
